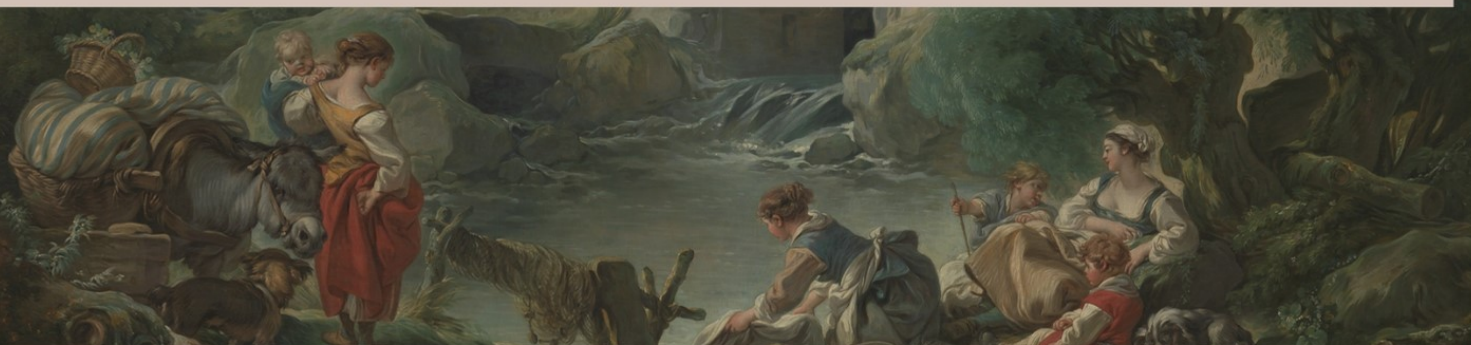
Women's roles in colonial America are often underrepresented. Join us in celebrating all the contributions that women made, and learn about the hardships they faced.
